- Gambling for longer periods of time.
- Lying about the extent of gambling.
- Missing work or school to gamble.
- Neglecting responsibilities to gamble.
- Using gambling as an escape.
- Gambling with money that's needed to pay bills.
- Believing the 'big win' will bring gambling under control.

The more signs a person shows, the greater the likelihood that he or she may have lost control of their gambling.

Quiz Answers

1. **b) Same.** The chances of winning are always the same. The number of past wins and losses has nothing to do with when the next payout will come. All vlt payouts are random and therefore unpredictable.
2. **b) Set percentage.** Vlt's are programmed to keep a set percentage of the money played over time. This is referred to as a "house advantage." The exact percentage varies from game to game.
3. **a) "Hope to win, expect to lose"** is a healthy attitude to have when gambling. We all hope to win, but if you recognize that the more you play, the more you pay, then you can set limits and spend only what is affordable for you.

Video Lottery Terminals (Vlt's)



Playing vlts should be fun!

As with all forms of entertainment, there is a cost to play.

Play for fun, not to make money.

Video Lottery Terminals (VLTs) are a form of gambling entertainment. As with all forms of entertainment, there is a cost. Although players may win occasionally, **the longer you play the more money you will lose over time.** Nothing you do can change this fact.

The more you know, the better equipped you can be to keep gambling safe and fun.

When playing vlts, engage your GameSense with these tips:

- **Play for fun, not to make money.**

VLTs are programmed to take in more money on average than they pay out in wins. So look at gambling as entertainment, like catching a concert or a movie, not a source of income.

- **Know how the game works and what the odds are before playing.**

The more you know about the games, the better equipped you are to make informed decisions before and while you play.

- **Set a budget and stick to it.**

Keeping it fun means playing within your means. When you set and stick to a budget, you spend only money you can afford to lose.

- **Set a time limit before you play.**

When you make a plan for how much time you can afford to spend gambling (and stick to it), you are more likely to stay within your set budget and not miss out on the other things you need.

- **Don't chase losses.**

Accept them as the cost of entertainment. Wondering if you can win back losses by playing more? It's possible, but unlikely. "Chasing losses" almost always leads to bigger losses.

- **Balance gambling with other types of leisure activities.** Finding other types of entertainment to enjoy will help make sure that gambling doesn't become your main activity or a big part of your life.

- **Take frequent breaks.** Every once in a while, it's a good idea to walk away from the game you're playing. Taking a break can help you make smarter decisions.
